### **Supporting Kinship Caregivers**

Step Up Parents (SUP) is uniquely positioned in the nonprofit space to serve kinship families impacted by substance use disorder (SUD). There is no other organization doing what we do. While many nonprofits address the treatment and recovery needs of individuals with SUD, we address the needs of their children and the kinship caregivers who step up to raise them. By supporting this often overlooked community, we help destigmatize SUD and provide a safe forum in which caregivers can ask for help. What began in 2019 as a call to action to help one family is now a financial safety net for kinship caregivers throughout New Hampshire and Southern Maine.

Kinship caregivers face many challenging circumstances that threaten family stability and security, the most immediate of which is often financial hardship. In many cases, caregivers are completely unprepared for the arrival of children, and they need everything. We provide financial assistance for food, clothing, shelter, baby supplies, beds, auto repair, childcare, utilities, and more. We recognize the significant collateral damage caused by parental substance use disorder, and we prioritize meeting the unique financial needs of individual families.

Our mission is straightforward and direct - to bridge gaps in household budgets so that kinship caregivers can cover the costs of raising the innocent children who are unexpectedly in their care. We have clearly tapped into a need. Together, we can make a meaningful difference for the children whose lives have been turned upside down by parental substance use disorder and the heroes who step up to raise them.

Step Up Parents provides financial assistance to kinship caregivers in New Hampshire and Southern Maine who are raising the children of parents with substance use disorder. We are dedicated to honoring the efforts of these caregivers as well as valuing their dignity and supporting their family's well-being.



### **Message from our Executive Director**

Dear Friends of Step Up Parents,

Last year was filled with milestones and proud accomplishments. We continued to solidify our place in the nonprofit landscape as a needed and vital resource for kinship families devastated by parental substance use disorder. Our most exciting development was our expansion into York County, Maine. Helping Maine kinship families was always a long-range plan, and we were thrilled to realize this goal in May. Our hope is to expand into other areas of the state in the coming years.



In 2023, Step Up Parents served a record number of families – 186 families last year, compared to 32 families in our first year of operation! In total, we have helped over 300 families, impacted almost 600 kinship kids, and given over \$300,000 in direct assistance. We meet so many remarkable families living under the most challenging circumstances through our work, and their gratitude always astounds us.

Organizationally, 2023 brought many changes. We hired our first support staff, added new faces to our Board of Directors, and said goodbye to some board members who were instrumental in building SUP. Personally and professionally, the most significant change came with my decision to step aside as Executive Director in order to hire a more seasoned nonprofit professional to lead SUP into the future. Although I am stepping down as ED, I will continue to be involved and will take a seat on SUP's board.

My focus has always been to create a way to help and honor heroic kinship caregivers that was quick, easy, meaningful and done with respect, validation, and appreciation. SUP has grown far beyond my modest expectations, and this experience has enriched my life immeasurably. I am forever grateful to everyone who has helped make SUP a reality. SUP was built with grass roots enthusiasm, on-the-job training, and a drive to make an immediate and lasting difference. I am proud to say that we accomplish this every day.

Of course, our success is completely dependent on the generosity of our donors. Our funders are our life blood, and we are truly appreciative of their commitment to helping families suffering the collateral damage of parental substance use disorder. To all who support our efforts, I want to personally thank you from the bottom of my heart.

Looking ahead, I am excited to see where our new Executive Director, Jessica Parker, takes SUP. She brings invaluable nonprofit experience in the substance use disorder space and a genuine commitment to our mission. Under her leadership, SUP will start a whole new chapter, while maintaining our founding principles and core belief that "Even heroes need a hand."






