Dear Friends,

In reflecting on 2022, it was the year that solidified Step Up Parents as a critical resource for grandparents and other relative caregivers who have stepped up to raise children so profoundly impacted by parental substance misuse. What began in 2019 as a call to action to help one New Hampshire family is now a financial safety net for kinship caregivers throughout the state.

With historical inflation, we saw an increase in applications and the amount of assistance requested in 2022. Many of our kinship caregivers live on fixed incomes with no ability to absorb higher costs. Proudly and thankfully, we have successfully fulfilled 100% of requests that meet our mission. Because of our generous donors, we have been able to answer the call of deserving kinship families for the last four years. Our organization has experienced exponential growth since its inception and has kept pace with investments in our growth and long-term sustainability. Last year we hired our first Executive Director and expanded our Board of Directors, all of whom bring significant expertise to their roles.

Our greatest joy, and the reason why we do what we do, is the heartfelt and touching gratitude from our families. They inspire our mission and motto, "Even Heroes Need a Hand." From the largest to the smallest assist, we know and hear what that small act means to a struggling family. So many of the caregivers we have helped are not only grateful for the bill we may have paid, but for the fact that they're not alone. This validation is priceless. What they do each day for the children now in their care is truly amazing and selfless. Step Up Parents is committed to honoring their efforts, preserving their dignity, and responding to their immediate needs, and it is our pleasure to help them.

Our kinship families

In 2022, Step Up Parents saw a tremendous increase in demand for our programming, with a 55% increase in the number of families assisted and a 91% increase in direct assistance given, well exceeding our goal and expectations. With so many of our constituent families living on fixed incomes, we recognize that it is especially difficult for them to pay for basic needs in the face of rising costs. In response, we increased our annual cap on financial assistance per family. Many kinship caregivers take on a lifetime commitment to the children in their care and reapply for assistance each year. We are happy to be a reliable resource for them. We have now assisted kinship families in all ten New Hampshire counties and 110 towns or cities.





Shining a Spotlight

Working collaboratively with our local community partners is critical to our outreach and programming. In 2022, we increased our network of referring partners, our "validators," who provide the initial interface with kinship families and refer three-quarters of our families to us. Our validators include the New Hampshire Kinship Navigators, DCYF, family resource centers, health centers, schools, city and town welfare and human services departments, and other social service agencies. We are grateful for these working relationships, which have enabled us to expand quickly throughout the state and, most importantly, to reach and serve deserving kinship families.



Shannon Lavertu, pictured left and on the cover of Parable Magazine, is one of Step Up Parents' community validators. She is a Kinship Navigator with NH Children's Trust's Kinship Navigator Program, which links grandparents and other family caregivers with resources and support groups.

–Karen, a grandmother who, with her husband, adopted three of her grandchildren when their parents, now deceased, lost parental rights. We helped the family with a car payment.




